## Match background

---

Tottenham Hotspur and Borussia Dortmund have got to know each other well over the last four seasons, with little between the sides as they prepare to meet for the fifth time.

- While Dortmund dominated the sides' first meeting, Tottenham held the upper hand when the clubs were reunited last season. The German club – in the round of 16 for the fifth time in seven seasons – come into this tie having finished first in Group A, while Tottenham claimed the runners-up spot in Group B thanks to a memorable 1-1 draw at Barcelona on matchday six.

### Previous meetings

- All four of the sides' past contests have come in the past three years.
- In the 2015/16 UEFA Europa League round of 16, Dortmund were 3-0 winners in the home first leg – Marco Reus scoring twice – before a 2-1 success at White Hart Lane despite Heung-Min Son's goal for the home side.
- Tottenham turned the tables in last season's UEFA Champions League group stage, winning 3-1 at Wembley – Son opening the scoring with Harry Kane adding two more – and 2-1 in Germany, the same two Spurs players again on the scoresheet.
- While Tottenham finished first in their section ahead of holders – and eventual champions – Real Madrid, Dortmund had to settle for third place.

### Form guide

#### Tottenham

- This is only Spurs' third UEFA Champions League round of 16 tie, with their record standing at W1 L1. In 2010/11 they won 1-0 away to AC Milan and on aggregate; 12 months ago they drew 2-2 at Juventus in the first leg but bowed out after a 2-1 home defeat.
- Tottenham have never won a home match in the UEFA Champions League knockout rounds (D1 L2), scoring just one goal.
- Tottenham's most successful UEFA Champions League campaign came in 2010/11, when they reached the quarter-finals. This is their fourth campaign overall, and their third in a row.
- Tottenham were unbeaten at home to German clubs (W6 D1) before succumbing to Dortmund in 2016; they lost their next such match too, to Bayer Leverkusen in November 2016, before beating Dortmund last season.
- Spurs' record in two-legged knockout ties against German clubs is W4 L3, although they have lost the last two.
- This season, Mauricio Pochettino's side lost 4-2 at home to Barcelona in their first home game, but beat PSV Eindhoven (2-1) and Internazionale (1-0) in the next two. That helped them overtake Inter to snatch second place behind Barça; Spurs had one point after three matches.
- The London club won three of their four home games in last season's UEFA Champions League. Before beating Dortmund on matchday one in 2017/18, they had won just one of their previous five European home fixtures.

#### Dortmund

- The most recent of Dortmund's four UEFA Champions League round of 16 ties came in 2016/17, when they lost the first leg 1-0 at Benfica but went through with a 4-0 home success.
- That gave the German club a record of W3 L1 at this stage of the competition.
- The German club have won only one of their last six knockout phase matches in UEFA competition (D2 L3), 3-2 against Atalanta in last season's UEFA Europa League round of 32 first leg.
- Dortmund's record in two-legged knockout ties against English clubs is W3 L2; they lost the most recent, against Liverpool in the 2015/16 UEFA Europa League quarter-finals (1-1 home, 3-4 away).
- Dortmund have lost on three of their last four trips to England – the exception that 2016 success at Spurs – and seven of their 12 games away to English clubs overall (W4 D1).
- In this season's group stage, Lucien Favre's side won 1-0 at Club Brugge on matchday one – ending a run of six UEFA Champions League away matches without a victory (D2 L4) – and 2-0 at Monaco either side of a 2-0 defeat at Atlético Madrid, helping them to collect 13 points overall. Dortmund conceded the fewest goals in the group stage (two) and kept the most clean sheets (five).
- The victories at Club Brugge and Monaco are the only two Dortmund have managed in their last 11 European away matches (D4 L5).
- Before this season, Dortmund had won only one of their last 11 UEFA Champions League fixtures (D3 L7).

- This is Dortmund's seventh UEFA Champions League campaign in eight years, and 13th overall; they were winners in 1997, and runners-up in 2013.

#### **Links and trivia**

- This is one of only two ties in the round of 16 not featuring a reigning domestic champion, the other being Ajax-Real Madrid.

- Kane and Dier found the net in England's 3-2 friendly win against Germany in March 2016; Götze and Reus played for Germany.
- These clubs have two former players in common: midfielder Steffen Freund went to White Hart Lane from Dortmund in 1998; defender Young-Pyo Lee left Spurs for Dortmund in 2008.

- Spurs have drawn only three games this season in all competitions, most recently at Barcelona on matchday six; their record since is W11 L4.
- Mauricio Pochettino's side have lost two of their last six home matches, having won the previous six, although they made it three Wembley wins in a row on Sunday with a 3-1 defeat of Leicester.
- The 1-0 home win against Newcastle on 2 February is Tottenham's only clean sheet in seven games.
- Heung-Min Son has scored ten goals in his last 11 Spurs matches.
- Spurs lost to Chelsea in the English League Cup semi-finals on 24 January, going out on penalties after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- Tottenham are also out of the FA Cup, losing 2-0 at Crystal Palace on 27 January in the last 32.
- Harry Kane, who scored four times in the group stage, has not played since damaging ankle ligaments in the 1-0 home defeat by Manchester United on 13 January.
- Dele Alli has been out since 20 January with a hamstring injury while Ben Davies (groin, out since 24 January) has also been sidelined.
- Eric Dier missed Sunday's win against Leicester through illness.

- BVB's record since matchday six is W4 D3 L1. One of those draws, 3-3 at home to Werder Bremen in the last 16 of the German Cup on 5 February, preceded a 4-2 defeat on penalties.
- Dortmund also drew 3-3 on Saturday, conceding three times in the last 15 minutes to let slip a three-goal cushion at home to Hoffenheim.
- Against Hoffenheim, Jadon Sancho scored his eighth Bundesliga goal, the youngest player ever to reach that total aged 18 years 321 days.
- Mario Götze, who provided a goal and an assist on Saturday, has two goals and two assists in his last five league games. The strike against Hoffenheim was his 50th in the Bundesliga.

- Dortmund coach Lucien Favre missed the Hoffenheim match through illness, with assistants Manfred Stefes and Edin Terzic taking charge of the team.
- Marco Reus, who has scored in his last three competitive games for BVB, had to be substituted at half-time against Bremen with a thigh injury and has not featured since.
- As both first-choice goalkeepers Roman Bürki and Marwin Hitz were missing due to illness, Eric Oelschlägel made his professional debut against Bremen. Sancho, Marcel Schmelzer (both ill) and Łukasz Piszczek (foot) were also ruled out; Bürki, Sancho and Piszczek started against Hoffenheim with Schmelzer an unused substitute.
- Manuel Akanji (hip) has been out since 18 December, when BVB suffered their only Bundesliga defeat this season, 2-1 at Fortuna Düsseldorf.
- Leonardo Balerdi, who joined in January from Boca Juniors, has not played since 25 January because of a facial injury.
- Paco Alcácer, who is still without a goal in 2019, had set a new record at Fortuna Düsseldorf when he scored his tenth Bundesliga goal as a substitute, surpassing the old record for the most goals by a substitute in a whole Bundesliga season which had been held jointly by Nils Petersen (Freiburg, 2016/17) and Viorel Ganea (Stuttgart, 2002/03).
- Sixteen different players scored for Dortmund in the first 14 league games, a new Bundesliga record. Raphaël Guerreiro made it 17 when he found the net in a 5-1 win against Hannover 96 on 26 January.
- Sancho was the youngest player to score in this season's group stage. He was aged 18 years 213 days when he found the net against Atlético Madrid on matchday three.

***Video Assistant Referees (VAR) will be introduced into the UEFA Champions League from this round. The VAR will be used in order to support the referee when making decisions concerning four match-changing situations:***

- 1. Goals***
- 2. Incidents in the penalty area***
- 3. Red cards***
- 4. Mistaken identity***

***The VAR will inform the referee when there is evidence of a clear and obvious mistake in one of these match-changing situations. The referee can then use the review area next to the pitch to take a final decision. The VAR is also able to take into account any infringement that could have taken place in the immediate build-up to the incident (the attacking phase of play).***

***Decisions like offside or whether a foul was committed inside or outside the penalty area will be recommended to the referee directly by the VAR and no on-field review necessarily takes place in such cases. The on-field review process will be communicated within the stadium using either the stadium screens or the public announcement system.***

**Playing career:** Newell's Old Boys, Espanyol (three times), Paris Saint-Germain, Bordeaux

**Coaching career:** Espanyol, Southampton, Tottenham

- A tough-tackling central defender, Pochettino was a product of Newell's Old Boys in Argentina where he briefly played with the legendary Diego Maradona during his five years in the senior squad.
- He moved to Europe in 1994 to join Spanish side Espanyol and won the Copa del Rey in 2000, before joining Paris in January 2001. After a stint at Bordeaux, returned to Espanyol, initially on loan, before hanging up his boots in 2006 having won another Copa del Rey. Capped 20 times by Argentina, appearing in the 2002 FIFA World Cup.
- Switched to coaching with Espanyol in January 2009, with the club lying third from bottom in the Spanish Liga; guided them to a tenth-placed finish. Under Pochettino, three further mid-table finishes followed before a slow start to 2012/13 prompted his departure.
- Surprisingly resurfaced in England at Southampton in January 2013, succeeding Nigel Adkins; introduced a high-pressing, attacking style which helped the club keep clear of relegation trouble. In his first full season in charge, took Saints to eighth position with 56 points – a new club record.
- Appointed Tottenham manager on a five-year contract in May 2014, and led the side to the English League Cup final in his debut campaign, only to lose out to Chelsea. The following season, 2015/16, Pochettino's side were in contention to win the club's first league title since 1961 until a draw at Chelsea with two games to go; nevertheless finished third to book a UEFA Champions League return, and finished a place higher, as Premier League runners-up, in 2016/17, before claiming third spot again the following season.

### Lucien Favre

---

**Coaching career:** Echallens (youth), Echallens, Yverdon-Sport, Servette, Zürich, Hertha Berlin, Borussia Mönchengladbach, Nice, Borussia Dortmund

- Capped 24 times by Switzerland, Favre was a playmaker during his playing days, with his career blighted by a persistent knee injury. Nevertheless, he won the 1985 Swiss league with Servette, two years after being voted Footballer of the Year.
- During his first stint as a coach he guided Echallens into the second tier for the first time in their history, before winning promotion to the top flight at his new club Yverdon. In 2001 he won the Swiss Cup with Servette, also guiding the club to the UEFA Cup fourth round, and joined Zürich in spring 2003, winning the Swiss Cup (2005) as well as back-to-back league titles in 2006 and 2007, being voted Swiss coach of the year two years running.
- In summer 2007, he left for Germany to join Hertha, unexpectedly guiding the capital side to fourth place in 2008/09. He was voted coach of the year in Germany after that term, but left his post in September.
- Took over at Gladbach in February 2011 and guided them to safety via the relegation play-offs before finishing fourth the next season to return the club to Europe after 16 years. In 2014/15, a third-placed finish in the Bundesliga earned Gladbach a UEFA Champions League group stage place and Favre Germany's coach of the year award for a second time.
- Resigned in September 2015 and took over at French side Nice the following May, overseeing a third-placed finish in 2016/17. Returned to Germany to take charge of Dortmund in May 2018.

## Competition facts

---

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

#### Overall records

- In 2012/13, Chelsea became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to CSKA Moskva.
- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

#### Group stage

- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 20 occasions, four more than Real Madrid and five more than Bayern München and Manchester United.
- Bayern München (2 April 2013 to 27 November 2013) and Real Madrid (23 April 2014 to 18 February 2015) jointly hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with ten. Bayern surpassed the previous mark of nine, set by Barcelona between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003.
- Six teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain (1994/95), Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12 and 2014/15).
- Twenty-one teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently AEK Athens in 2018/19.
- In 2017/18, Paris Saint-Germain set a new group stage record by scoring 25 goals, with Liverpool (23) also eclipsing the old mark of 21 set by Borussia Dortmund in 2016/17. Manchester United (1998/99), Barcelona (2011/12, 2016/17) and Real Madrid (2013/14) all managed 20.
- Only Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05), Maccabi Haifa (2009/10) and Dinamo Zagreb (2016/17) have failed to score in a group stage.
- BATE Borisov conceded 24 goals in 2014/15, a new group stage record which was matched by Legia Warszawa in 2016/17. The previous mark, 22, was held by Dinamo Zagreb (2011/12) and Nordsjælland (2012/13); Malmö shipped 21 in 2015/16.
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06), Manchester United (2010/11), Monaco (2014/15), Paris Saint-Germain (2015/16) and Barcelona (2017/18) all let in just one.
- Matchday six of the 2013/14 marked FCSB's 23rd successive game in the competition without a victory, surpassing the previous record of 22 set by Spartak Moskva between December 2000 and November 2006.
- Anderlecht hold the unwanted record for successive defeats in the competition, group stage to final, having lost 12 in a row between December 2003 and November 2005. Dinamo Zagreb are next with 11 consecutive losses on two occasions, from September 2011 to November 2012 and ongoing since September 2015.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is six points: Zenit in 2013/14 and Roma in 2015/16. Since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, eight teams have made it through with seven points: Legia Warszawa (1995/96), Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000), Liverpool (2001/02), Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus (both 2002/03), Rangers and Werder Bremen (2005/06) and Basel (2014/15).
- Napoli failed to qualify from their group with 12 points in 2013/14, the highest total of any team not to reach the next stage when the top two in each section progressed. Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000), Borussia Dortmund (2002/03 – both second group stage), PSV Eindhoven (2003/04), Olympiacos and Dynamo Kyiv (both 2004/05), Werder Bremen (2006/07), Manchester City (2011/12), Chelsea and Cluj (both 2012/13), Benfica (2013/14) and Porto (2015/16) all

missed out with ten points.

### **Goalscoring records**

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Eleven more players, also including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Cristiano Ronaldo for Real Madrid on matchday six in 2015/16.
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, eclipsing his own mark of nine in 2013/14, which Luiz Adriano matched in 2014/15 and Ronaldo himself equalled in 2017/18. Lionel Messi got ten goals in 2016/17; Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03) and Robert Lewandowski (2018/19) managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on matchday one of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, one more than Ronaldo.

### **Oldest and youngest players**

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years and 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg on 1 October 1997.
