Match background

Manchester United and Leipzig are both looking to consolidate after fine opening Group H wins as they meet at Old Trafford.

- While an 87th-minute Marcus Rashford goal earned United a 2-1 victory away to last season's finalists Paris Saint-Germain, Angeliño's double helped Leipzig to a 2-0 home success against group stage debutants İstanbul Başakşehir.
- This is the sides' first meeting and, while Leipzig will have fond memories of their only previous contests against an English club, United can draw on an unbeaten home record against German visitors stretching back almost 20 years.

Form guide

Manchester United

- This is United's 23rd UEFA Champions League group stage campaign, more than any other English side and fewer only than Barcelona and Real Madrid (both 25) and Porto and Bayern München (both 24) overall. They have qualified for the knockout phase on 18 occasions, also an English record.
- The three-time European champions' most recent appearance in the competition came in 2018/19, when they lost to Barcelona in the quarter-finals after a spectacular round of 16 comeback against Paris.
- Ole Gunnar Solskjær's side reached the UEFA Europa League semi-finals in 2019/20, losing to eventual champions Sevilla in the last four. They had finished first in their section on 13 points before comfortable aggregate wins against Club Brugge (6-1) and LASK (7-1) in the round of 32 and 16 respectively and a 1-0 extra-time defeat of Copenhagen in the one-off quarter-final. Sevilla proved too strong in the semis, however, United going down 2-1 in Cologne.
- United have finished first in their UEFA Champions League section 15 times, although only once since 2013/14.
- The Manchester club finished third in the Premier League in 2019/20.
- European Cup winners in 1968, United lifted the UEFA Champions League trophy in 1999 and 2008, also reaching the final in 2009 and 2011 – the latter four all under Sir Alex Ferguson.
- United have lost their last two home UEFA Champions League matches, and four of the last six (W1 D1), although they won all five games at Old Trafford in the 2019/20 UEFA Europa League, scoring 15 goals and conceding only one.
- This is the Red Devils' first meeting with a German club since a 3-2 loss at Wolfsburg in the 2015/16 UEFA Europa League group stage with Anthony Martial scoring the visitors' first goal. United had won the home game 2-1 – Juan Mata scoring their first goal from the penalty spot – to make it ten matches unbeaten against German teams at Old Trafford (W7 D3), since a 0-1 reverse against Bayern München in the 2000/01 UEFA Champions League quarter-final first leg (1-3 aggregate).

Leipzig

- This is Leipzig's third UEFA Champions League group campaign, all in the last four seasons, and their fourth foray into European football overall.
- The 2019/20 campaign proved to be the most successful in Leipzig's brief European history, Julian Nagelsmann's side going all the way to the semi-finals. Leipzig picked up 11 points to finish first in their section – they had come third in their two previous group stage campaigns in UEFA competition – ahead of Lyon, Benfica and Zenit.
- Leipzig then beat 2018/19 runners-up Tottenham in their first UEFA Champions League knockout tie (1-0 a, 3-0 h) before a 2-1 defeat of Atlético de Madrid in their one-off quarter-final in Lisbon. Paris Saint-Germain – who are also in Group H – ended their hopes in the semis, running out 3-0 winners.
- Leipzig have won nine of their 17 UEFA Champions League fixtures (D3 L5).
- Third in the Bundesliga for the second season in a row in 2019/20, this is Leipzig's fourth European campaign and only their 36th match. In 2017/18 they became the first team to make their European debut in the UEFA Champions League group stage.
- Leipzig won three of their four away games in last season's UEFA Champions League, drawing the other. Before 2019/20, they had been victorious in only three of their 12 away European matches (D4 L5).
- Leipzig's only previous fixtures against a Premier League club came in last season's round of 16, Nagelsmann's side beating Tottenham 1-0 away and 3-0 at home in what was their first UEFA Champions League knockout tie.

- Marcel Sabitzer and Cavani both scored as Sabitzer's Austria recorded a 2-1 friendly win against Cavani's Uruguay in November 2017.

- A Pogba goal helped France to a 2-1 home win against Sweden in 2018 FIFA World Cup qualifying in November 2016, Forsberg scoring for the visitors, whose side also included Lindelöf.

- Yussuf Poulsen scored his first international goal in Denmark's 2-0 win at home to Nemanja Matić's Serbia in UEFA EURO 2016 qualifying in June 2015.

- Edinson Cavani's next goal in UEFA club competition will be his 50th.

- The win in Paris was United's tenth consecutive away victory in all competitions, a new club record. Their last away defeat was at Liverpool in the Premier League on 19 January (0-2), since when their record is W15 D3.

- On Saturday United drew 0-0 at home to Chelsea in the Premier League, meaning they have failed to win any of their first three home league matches for the first time since 1972/73.

- Cavani made his United debut as a second-half substitute against Chelsea.

- United lost two of their first three Premier League games of the season, both at home. Crystal Palace were 3-1 winners at Old Trafford on 9 September; on 4 October, Tottenham inflicted a 6-1 loss on United, their heaviest home defeat since losing by the same scoreline to Manchester City in October 2011.

- That defeat by Spurs was the third time United have conceded six goals in a Premier League match; they trailed 4-1 at half-time, the first time they had conceded four goals in the first half of a league match since November 1957.

- United conceded 11 goals in their first three league games, their worst total since 1930/31, when they conceded 13 in a season that ended in relegation.

- Ole Gunnar Solskjær's side were unbeaten in 14 Premier League matches (W9 D5) before losing to Palace in their opening game of the campaign.

- After 3-0 wins away to Luton and Brighton, United will travel to Everton in the English League Cup quarter-finals in the week beginning 21 December.

- Marcus Rashford scored a penalty in England's 2-1 UEFA Nations League win at home to Belgium on 10 October, the fourth consecutive competitive international in which he had found the net. The run ended three days later in a 1-0 home defeat by Denmark.

- Donny van de Beek scored the Netherlands' equaliser in a 1-1 UEFA Nations League draw away to Italy on 14 October – the Oranje's first goal under new coach Frank de Boer.

- On 7 October, Brandon Williams made his debut for England in a 3-3 draw against Andorra in UEFA European Under-21 Championship qualifying.

- Eric Bailly was an unused substitute in a 4-1 win at Newcastle on 17 October but missed the trip to Paris and is

expected to be sidelined for up to four weeks with a muscle injury.

- Mason Greenwood, Jesse Lingard (both knocks) and Harry Maguire (muscle) were also absent on Matchday 1. Maguire and substitute Greenwood both returned against Chelsea.
- Rashford was made a Member of the British Empire (MBE) in the Queen's birthday honours list on 10 October.

- Péter Gulácsi's next appearance in UEFA club competition will be his 50th.
- Leipzig's first competitive match in 2020/21 was a 3-0 win at 2. Bundesliga side Nürnberg in the first round of the German Cup on 12 September, Hee-Chan Hwang scoring on his debut.
- Leipzig kicked off their Bundesliga campaign with a 3-1 against Mainz on 20 September before a 1-1 draw in Leverkusen the following week.
- On 3 October Leipzig prevailed 4-0 against Schalke to go top of the Bundesliga table, and maintained that position with victories at Augsburg on 17 October (2-0) and at home to Hertha Berlin on Saturday (2-1).
- Dayot Upamecano opened the scoring against Hertha, his fourth Bundesliga goal for Leipzig and his first since 12 May 2018, also against the Berlin club.
- Before Saturday, Angeliño had scored in three Leipzig games in a row, four goals in total – the first time the 23-year-old has found the net in successive matches in his professional career.
- Three days after his debut for France in the UEFA Nations League in Sweden, Upamecano scored his first goal in a 4-2 win against Croatia on 8 September.
- Willi Orban was on target for Hungary in a 3-1 win in Bulgaria in the UEFA EURO 2020 semi-final play-offs on 8 October.
- On 11 October Sørloth scored in Norway's 4-0 UEFA Nations League win against Romania.
- Due to persistent knee problems Lukas Klostermann underwent surgery on 21 October.
- Amadou Haidara has missed Leipzig's last three matches due to illness.
- On Saturday substitute Marcel Sabitzer made his first appearance in the Bundesliga this season having sustained a thigh injury on 24 September. He marked the occasion with the penalty winner, his first career spot kick at club level although he also scored a penalty in Austria's 2-1 UEFA Nations League win in Norway on 4 September.
- A knee injury has sidelined Konrad Laimer since 18 August; he underwent surgery in mid-September and is back in light training.
- Ibrahima Konaté underwent hip surgery on 24 July, returning on Matchday 1.
- Yussuf Poulsen extended his contract until 2024 on 3 October.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

Overall records

- Chelsea in 2012/13 are the only defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to CSKA Moskva.
- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern München were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
- Bayern's victory against Paris Saint-Germain in the 2020 UEFA Champions League final was their 11th successive win in the competition (18 September 2019 to 23 August 2020), setting a new record. Bayern themselves (2 April 2013 to 27 November 2013) and Real Madrid (23 April 2014 to 18 February 2015) jointly held the previous best with ten, one more than Barcelona's winning run between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003.

Group stage

- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 21 occasions, five more than Real Madrid and Bayern München and six more than Manchester United. Barça also hold the record for the most unbeaten group stage campaigns with 13, five more than Real Madrid.
- Seven teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain (1994/95), Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage), Real Madrid (2011/12 and 2014/15) and Bayern (2019/20).
- Twenty-one teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently AEK Athens in 2018/19.
- In 2017/18, Paris Saint-Germain set a new group stage record by scoring 25 goals, one more than Bayern München managed in 2019/20. Liverpool are next on the list having scored 23 in 2017/18 with Borussia Dortmund hitting 21 in 2016/17. Manchester United (1998/99), Barcelona (2011/12, 2016/17) and Real Madrid (2013/14) all managed 20.
- Only Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05), Maccabi Haifa (2009/10) and Dinamo Zagreb (2016/17) have failed to score in a group stage.
- BATE Borisov conceded 24 goals in 2014/15, a new group stage record which was matched by Legia Warszawa in 2016/17. The previous mark, 22, was held by Dinamo Zagreb (2011/12) and Nordsjælland (2012/13).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06), Manchester United (2010/11), Monaco (2014/15), Paris Saint-Germain (2015/16) and Barcelona (2017/18) all let in just one.
- Matchday 6 of 2013/14 marked FCSB's 23rd successive game in the competition without a victory, surpassing the previous record of 22 set by Spartak Moskva between December 2000 and November 2006.
- Anderlecht hold the unwanted record for successive defeats in the competition, group stage to final, having lost 12 in a row between December 2003 and November 2005. Dinamo Zagreb are next with 11 consecutive losses on two occasions, from September 2011 to November 2012 and September 2015 to December 2016.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is six points: Zenit in 2013/14 and Roma in 2015/16. Since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, ten teams have made it through with seven points: Legia Warszawa (1995/96), Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000), Liverpool (2001/02, second group stage), in 2002/03 Lokomotiv Moskva (first group stage) and eventual finalists Juventus (second group stage), Rangers and Werder Bremen (2005/06), Galatasaray (2013/14), Basel (2014/15) and Atalanta (2019/20).
- Napoli failed to qualify from their group with 12 points in 2013/14, the highest total of any team not to reach the next stage when the top two in each section progressed. Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000, second group stage), Borussia

Dortmund (2002/03, second group stage), PSV Eindhoven (2003/04), Olympiacos and Dynamo Kyiv (both 2004/05), Werder Bremen (2006/07), Manchester City (2011/12), Chelsea and Cluj (both 2012/13), Benfica (2013/14), Porto (2015/16) and Ajax (2019/20) all missed out with ten points.

Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Thirteen more players, also including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Josip Iličić for Atalanta in the 2019/20 round of 16 second leg against Valencia. He was the third player to score four in a game that season, all away from home, after group stage quadruples from Bayern's Serge Gnabry (Matchday 2 at Tottenham) and Robert Lewandowski (Matchday 5 at Crvena zvezda).
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, Lionel Messi got ten goals in 2016/17, a figure matched by Robert Lewandowski in 2019/20; Ronaldo (2013/14, 2017/18) and Luiz Adriano (2014/15) scored nine while Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03), Lewandowski (2018/19) and Erling Braut Haaland (2019/20) all managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético de Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years and 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua București on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
